

No 'invasive' tree species are listed as they could cause environmental harm by spreading unchecked through our Pinelands environment.

Follow the steps below to submit your application to plant a tree in the Common Grounds area.

1 - List your reason(s) you want to install a tree on Common Grounds.
2- Review the 'Approved Replenishment Trees' sheet and list your requested tree(s).
3 - Attach a rough sketch of your property noting the proximity of the Common Ground area you are requesting to have a tree planted. Be aware to keep open all access areas for emergency services into the Common Grounds and of the necessity to avoid underground utilities while digging.
4- Check which method of installation you are planning to use to install your tree?
() purchase and install the tree myself.
() hire a contractor to purchase and install the tree.

The financial cost to you , the homeowner, could range from \$200- \$500 to cover the price of the tree, soil amendments, mulch, tree stakes, wire-enclosure & support poles to protect against deer browse / antler rubbing.
The time cost to you , the homeowner, would be the requirements to water the tree and maintain the enclosure for 12-months after the installation. Once installed, your tree becomes the property of the SRP Westerly HOA.
Sign, date & return this form with your sketch to the Trustee mailbox in the Clubhouse. <i>Do not plant your tree until you have the final written approval from the HOA.</i> It is recommended you speak with any neighbors about the plan installation of your tree. The turn-around time to review and approve or deny your request could take up to 30 days from the date of your submission so your patience is appreciated.

September 'DIRT'

from the Silver Ridge Park / Westerly Garden Committee 2024

'DIRT' on what you need to know:

Have you ever wondered what those green, wrinkly patches are that are on the trunk of your tree. Is it a disease? Is it hurting your tree? Will it hurt you? The answer is 'NO' to all three questions.

What you are looking at is a 'lichen', one of nature's most amazing creations. A lichen is an organism that is part fungus and part algae. These two plants live in a 'mutualistic relationship', meaning that each one benefits the other. The fungus part makes up most of the structure and it collects and holds moisture from rain drops. The algae part grows on the fungus and fixes nitrogen from the air which it shares with the fungus. The lichen only uses the tree trunk for something to attach to. There are not roots on a lichen to take nutrients from the tree. The common lichen that grows on our trees here in Silver Ridge Park / Westerly is the Greenshield Lichen (Flavoparmelia caperata).

Unlike plants that we are familiar with producing seeds that grow into new plants; lichens develop fruiting bodies that produce spores. These spores can produce another fungus which then has to find another algal partner to grow to mature size. Lichens grow very slowly; a two-inch sq. section could be decades old!

Lichens need clean, fresh air to survive. They cannot live in cities or next to congested roadways. So resist the urge to get out your power-washer to scrub off the lichen from your trees. They are a sign of fresh air in our neighborhood!

'DIRT' on what we have scheduled:

Wednesday SEPTEMBER 11th monthly Fun Project starting at 10am. With the (hopefully) cooler weather we will be working on our next garden bed project: rock removal, soil prep, mulching, etc. Bring your gardening gloves and enthusiasm to the ClubHouse.

Wednesday SEPTEMBER 25th Monthly Meeting starting at 7pm. We will discuss what 'deer resistant' spring-flowering bulbs to buy now and plant next month. As always, bring your questions.

Interesting Facts about



Sept. 10, 1752 doesn't exist. Neither does Sept. 4 or Sept. 12, in British history, at least. It's known as the English calendar riots of 1752, and it's a lost 11 days in British history, when the country finally changed over from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar. Named after the Catholic Pope Gregory who introduced it, it's no wonder the Protestant nation of England wasn't too keen to join the ranks despite the majority of its neighbors using it for almost 150 years at that point.

Following the calendar of Julius Caesar, by 1752, the slight miscalculation in the Julian system made for 11 minutes too many every year since its implementation in 46 B.C., and it made Easter entirely too late in the year - 11 days later than the rest of Europe, in fact.

So in Sept. 1752, Parliament rectified the problem. They simply skipped 11 days, kind of. On Sept. 2, the country was under the Julian calendar, but on Sept. 3, they switched to the Gregorian calendar, and the day became Sept. 14, 1752.

Rumor has it in the days preceding the change, there was civil unrest and rioters in the streets demanding, "Give us our 11 days!" People believed their lives would be shortened, but moreover, they didn't much appreciate holy days being moved in favor of a Catholic calendar.

Most historians now believe the riots themselves never actually happened. What did happen was William Hogarth's painting entitled "An Election Entertainment," based on "The World," a satirical journal by Lord Chesterfield, who introduced the calendar bill initially.

The calendar was among the top political issues of the 1754 election. When Hogarth produced the painting in 1755 based on Election Night 1754, it was a satirical representation of the Whigs inside a tavern with Tory party members protesting outside, with a banner saying, "Give us our 11 days."



HAVE YOU FORGOTTEN?

September is a month of memorials. Sept. 11, 2001, a date infamously immortalized as 9/11 or Patriot Day, marks the commemoration of the day when members of the Islamic terrorist organization al-Qaeda hijacked planes coordinating attacks on the Twin Towers in New York City and the Pentagon. More than 3,000 people lost their lives during the deadliest terrorist attack on American soil and catapulting the country into the Global War on Terrorism.



THE MOST BIRTHDAYS

There are also a whole ton of birthday celebrations to be had in September. It's not the most common birth month - that title actually belongs to August before it, but somehow, September holds nine of the 10 most common birthdays in the calendar, according to USA Today.

The most common birthday is Sept. 9, followed by Sept. 19 and Sept. 12. Famous Sept. 9 birthdays include Adam Sandler, Michael Buble, Hunter Hayes, Colonel Sanders, Hugh Grant, Napoléon Bonaparte, Jack Trudeau, Otis Redding, Leo Tolstoy, Afrojack ... the list goes on and on.

But it's not the only date worth remembering in September. There's Labor Day on Sept. 4, an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American orkers; Constitution Day on Sept. 17, celebrating the the adop tion of the United States Constitution and those who have becom U.S. citizens; Native American Day on Sept. 22 honoring those indigenous peoples who were American before the rest of us, and let's not forget Grandparent's Day on Sept. 10.

As summer turns to fall, the autumn equinox formally brings the transition, on Sept. 22, marking the transition in the year.

Also on Sept. 22, 1862, then President Abraham Lincoln issued the ancipation Proclamation, marking the end of slavery in the United







An age certification document from the HOA is required for Certificate of Occupancy in the municipality of Berkeley Township, New Jersey.





In keeping with Berkeley Township shed ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective immediately, to install one (1) shed on their property, up to and including 64 square feet.

(8' x 8' x 8')


Modification of existing shed policy 11h in the architectural Rules and Regulations was voted for, approved and has changed to:

- 1. Sheds may not be placed anywhere other than the rear of the home.
- All sheds must remain within the sidelines of the home.
- Sheds may NOT be installed on common ground property.
- 4. Said shed shall be of any structure material the homeowner desires.
- 5. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxed by Berkeley Township.
- 6. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three feet from the back of the property line.
- 7. Although Berkeley Township requires only a 3 foot side setback, SRP Westerly requires all shed placement to remain within the sidelines of the home.
- 8. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, electrical wiring of sheds is not permitted.

9. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed against their home, it may not block any windows or doors.

 Homeowners MUST submit an architectural approval request form along with a drawing showing the location of the proposed shed to the SR Westerly Architectural Committee. (Architectural forms are available in your monthly copy of the Sign Post).

11. The homeowner must submit a zoning permit application, required fees and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall /Zoning Office. (Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township website or the Zoning Office.)
